Stay on topic

Don't post irrelevant links, comments, thoughts or pictures.

Say "Please" and Thank you"

Always remember to say "Please" and Thank you" when soliciting help from your peers.

DO NOT GUESS!

If you reply to a question from a peer, make sure your answer is accurate! If you're not 100% sure don't reply.

Be brief

If you write a long dissertation in response to a simple question, it's unlikely that anyone will spend the time to read through it all.

If your classmate makes a mistake, don't badger him or her for it. Just let it go – it happens to the best of us.

Respect the opinion of your peers. If you feel the need to disagree, do so respectfully

Don't badmouth others or call them.

and acknowledge the valid points in your classmate's argument. Acknowledge that others are entitled to have their own perspective on the issue. or their ideas, stupid. You may disagree with their ideas, but don't mock and disrespect the person

Don't type in ALL CAPS! If you do, it will look like you are screaming.

Don't write to sound...

Don't write anything that sounds angry or sarcastic, even as a joke, because without hearing your tone of voice, your peers and/or lecturer might not realise you're joking. RULE

Summarise all answers

RULE OF THUMB: If you wouldn't do or say something in real life, don't do it online either

If you ask a question and many people respond, summarise all answers and post that summary to benefit your whole class.

Quote when refering

If you refer to something a peer said earlier in the discussion, quote just a few key lines from their post so that others won't have to go back and figure out which post you're referring to.

Asking "easy to find" questions

Before asking a question, check the class FAQs or search the internet to see if the answer is obvious or easy to find.

Resolved issue

Check the most recent comments before you reply to an older comment since the issue might have already been resolved or opinions may have changed. RULE

Spelling and grammar matters

Run a spelling and grammar check before posting anything. It only takes a minute but contributes to you sounding more knowledgeable.
