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Learning on your terms, anywhere, anytime

NWU has implemented a hybridflexible (HyFlex) teaching approach, allowing students to participate in classes either in-person or online.

his offers various options: to attend physical classes or attend online, utilise recorded lectures through eFundi, the Learning Management System of the university, or even brush up on your understanding after attending physical class.

We connected with Danie Stoop, Director of Electronic Services (IT-ES), and Dr. Gerhard Du Plessis, Director of the Centralised Teaching and Learning Functions (CTLF), to gain insights into this innovative teaching and learning approach.

Danie further elaborated that NWU's transition to HyFlex came about due to the post-pandemic restrictions imposed on face-toface teaching on the NWU sites of delivery. They have equipped designated classrooms with advanced technology, working in tandem with stakeholders like Dr. Gerhard from CTLF to ensure that academic needs are effectively addressed.

Are HyFlex classrooms available across all campuses now?

Danie highlighted that designated classrooms on all NWU campuses are now equipped with advanced technology, including follow-me cameras, wireless microphones, and software for live-streaming, capturing, and storing lectures. The distribution is roughly proportional to campus size. The transition to the new system posed challenges in terms of adoption i.e., as requests for the installation of HyFlex classrooms couldn't always be accommodated due to, among other, venue access.

Dr. Gerhard revealed that extensive training was necessary to ensure lecturers comprehended the system's functioning. This process unfolded in two main aspects. He elucidated:

"Firstly, there was a need to prepare lecturers to utilise and gain proficiency in the new digital classroom environment. A series of workshops were conducted, with a specific focus on the technical aspects. The training sessions were repeated multiple times, accommodating both in-person and online formats to cater to the preferences of different lecturers," Dr Gerhard told us.

Secondly, although improving slightly, the slow adoption of the solution by lecturers is not restricted to NWU. Lasting post-pandemic effects on T&L, lecturer resistance against 'anything online', and expectations to return to 'normal' once back on campus, all contributed to the observed push-back. The hybrid classroom technology should be seen as part of a broader mix, not the sole solution.

How is it enabled?

"During the COVID-19 hard lock-down, Dr. Gerhard's team provided

lecturers with video equipment to conduct video-based classes from home during the Covid period. However, the equipment was better suited for close-up interaction in front of personal computers, than for lecture room use," Danie explained.

"In response, we swiftly sought appropriate alternative equipment. Recognizing that a complete room overhaul would disrupt classes, we devised a solution that leverages existing classroom setups. Through an automated camera system, a camera tracks and follows the lecturer, maintaining focus once locked onto them. This innovation allowed us to adapt without needing extensive room modifications," Danie added.

"Our options are two-fold: The first involves a complete room renovation with new equipment. This is a comprehensive renovation, which encompasses hybrid features. This approach takes around three weeks to complete. Alternatively, we offer a 'bolt-on' solution for urgent cases." Danie explained.

What is the objective behind having HyFlex classrooms?

A HyFlex classroom serves a dual purpose, functioning as both an in-person setting and a fully online digital classroom, catering to traditional lectures. Danie clarified that while the new system isn't flawless as it does not adequately deal with group work scenarios, otherwise it is highly effective. He explained that although a human cameraman would be ideal, practical constraints prevent its implementation in every room. Instead, they employ an Al-enabled camera that tracks and follows a person's movement within a centralised view. This camera is directed towards the lecture bench, automatically focusing on the lecturer as they approach it.

Who can access utilise Hyflex classroom?

Danie clarified that the transmission occurs via Teams, accessible to registered students and is also saved for future access. He highlighted the seamless integration with the Panopto application, specifically designed for recording purposes, which streamlines the experience for both students and lecturers. This ensures that online materials are accessible for later viewing. These attributes form the essence of HyFlex rooms, granting students the flexibility to participate synchronously or asynchronously, engaging with the online proceedings.

"The future holds an even more streamlined experience with Teams appliances having their identity locked to the classroom space information, allowing you to find your classroom online with the same room number that is on your timetable", Danie added.



One-on-one with our tech-savvy User of the Month - Nadine Smit

A: Using MS applications has made my work much more manageable. I appreciate the reminders and task management features that help me stay on top of deadlines. The various plug-ins available also improve teamwork collaboration.

Q: When did you start using Microsoft 365 applications?

A: I started using Microsoft tools when NWU made the shift. Recognising the advantages, I encouraged my colleagues to adopt it sooner.

Q: Do you use Microsoft applications on your mobile phone?

A: While some are hesitant about using work-related apps on personal devices, I have the Outlook and Microsoft Teams apps on my phone for better accessibility.

Q: How do you handle communication and calls?

A: For calls, I use Skype for Business. We have moved away from traditional phones to embrace online communication, and it has been a success.

Areas where Microsoft applications shine:

Microsoft Teams: Provides multiple spaces to share documents, although some colleagues find the distinctions between OneDrive and Outlook challenging to understand.

Hobbies:

Beyond her work, Nadine enjoys reading and cherishing quality time with family and friends. Switching off from technology and appreciating nature are important aspects of her life.

NextCloud

NextCloud is a free, open-source tool for storing, sharing, and collaborating on files and documents.


